

Mikado Lace

Crochet lace edging featuring mixed shells #h021 "Home Work", Rose publishing CO. (LTD.), 1881



UK term | US term

Chain stitch – ch

Double crochet / Single crochet – dc / sc

Treble / Double crochet – tr / dc

Shell - 3 tr/dc + 2 ch + 3tr/dc in the same stitch

Make 22 foundation chains.

Row 1: 3 ch skip, shell in next ch, 4 ch, 8 ch skip, 1 tr/dc + 3 ch + 1 tr/dc in next ch, 4 ch, shell in last ch, turn.



Row 2: 3 ch, shell in shell, 3ch, 8 tr/dc in space of 3 ch, 3 ch, shell in shell, turn.

Row 3: 5 ch, shell in shell, 2 ch, 1 tr/dc + 1ch in space between each tr/dc of previous row, 1 ch, shell in shell, turn.



Row 4: 3 ch, shell in shell, work 3 tr/dc in each space of 1ch, shell in shell,



make 8 tr/dc with 1 ch between in space of 5 ch, 1 dc/sc in last tr/dc of shell below (the shell of 1st row), turn.



work 1 tr/dc + 3 ch + 1 dc/sc in each space of 1 ch,





2 ch, shell in shell, 4 ch, 1 tr/dc + 3 ch + 1 tr/dc in space between third and fourth groups of 3tr/dc, 4 ch, shell in shell, turn.





Repeat 2 – 5 rows until you have reached your desired length.

Materials

Pearl cotton, crochet thread size 12, and steel crochet hook size 1.25 - 1.50 mm / 10 - 8. You may use any yarn of your choice, and a suitable hook.
